

UNIT NAME	DESCRIPTION
<b>Children's Services</b>	
7A - Child/Infant Care Unit	7A is an 18 bed General Pediatric Infant/Toddler unit primarily providing care for children age 0-6 years. Average daily census on the unit is 14 patients, with a blend of medical and surgical diagnoses. Common diagnoses include, but are not limited to, Respiratory Illness, Failure to Thrive, and Hyperbilirubinemia. The secured unit is composed of all private rooms. The staffing mix includes Registered Nurses, Patient Care Technicians, and Unit Secretaries.
7B - Peds Subspecialty Unit	7B is an 18 bed Pediatric Hematology/Oncology unit providing intermediate care for children age 0-18 years. Average daily census on the unit is 14 patients, with most common diagnoses including cancer and sickle cell anemia. The staffing mix includes Registered Nurse, Patient Care Technicians, and unit secretaries. The Registered Nurses become certified in administration of Chemotherapy when eligible. In addition to administration of chemotherapy and pain management during sickle cell crisis, one of the unique services provided is Bone Marrow Transfusion. Pediatric palliative care is available as needed. The secured unit is composed of all private rooms.
Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU)	The Pediatric Intensive Care unit is an 28 bed unit providing intensive and intermediate care to children ages 0-18 from across the state of South Carolina. The unit cares for patients with a blend of medical and surgical diagnoses. Common diagnoses include, but are not limited to, respiratory compromise, trauma, post-operative surgical patients requiring immediate intensive care support, and neurology/neurosurgery. In addition to ventilatory and cardiac support, the unit provides ECMO/CRRT, renal or peritoneal dialysis and additional complex supportive therapies. Pediatric Palliative care is available as needed. The staffing mix includes Registered Nurses, Patient Care Technicians, and Unit Secretaries with therapeutic supportive services such as Respiratory Therapy, Pediatric Dietitians, and Pediatric Pharmacist available as needed.
7E - Peds Medical/Surgical	7E is a 25 bed General Pediatric Medical Surgical unit primarily providing care for children age 6-18 years. Average daily census on the unit is 16 patients, with a blend of medical and surgical diagnoses. Common diagnoses include, but are not limited to, Orthopedic Surgery, Neurology/Neurosurgery, Ear, Nose, and Throat Surgery and Respiratory Illnesses to include Asthma. The secured unit is composed of all private rooms. The staffing mix includes Registered Nurses, Patient Care Technicians, and Unit Secretaries.
8D - Peds Cardiac (Telemetry)	8D is a 14 bed Pediatric Cardiac Intermediate/Stepdown unit providing care for children ages 0-18. Average Daily Census on the unit is 10 patients, with a blend of medical and surgical diagnoses. Most common diagnoses include Congenital Heart Defect, Prematurity, Failure to Thrive, and post-ICU Cardiac Care. Telemetry Monitoring for all Children's Hospital beds occurs on 8D. The staffing mix includes Registered Nurses, Patient Care Technicians, Cardiac Monitor Technicians and Unit Secretaries.
Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit (PCICU)	Pediatric Cardiology Intensive Care unit is a 14 bed Beacon Award-Winning unit and is the referral center for all major pediatric cardiac surgery in South Carolina. Average Daily Census on the unit is 12, with a blend of cardiac surgical and medical diagnoses. The PCICU cares for patients with congenital heart disease of any age based on care needs. Common procedures associated with this unit's care include cardiac surgery, Ventricular Assist Devices, Heart Transplant, cardiac catheterization, and all medical diagnoses associated with cardiac care for the children in South Carolina. In addition to ventilatory and cardiac support, the unit provides ECMO/CRRT and additional complex supportive therapies. Pediatric palliative care is available as needed. The staffing mix includes Registered Nurses, Patient Care Technicians, and Unit Secretaries with ancillary supportive services such as Respiratory Therapy, Pediatric Dietitians, and Pediatric Pharmacist available as needed. All PCICU beds are monitored beds.
Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) & Special Care Nurseries	The 66 bed Neonatal Intensive and Intermediate Care Units are located in our Children's Hospital. The MUSC NICU is the regional referral center for this area, providing care to premature and sick neonates. The average daily census is 66. The Neonatal ICUs provides medical and surgical care with most common diagnoses including prematurity, respiratory distress, and neonatal surgical conditions. In addition to respiratory and nutritional support, the NICUs provide ECMO/CRRT and surgical support. Pediatric Palliative care is available as needed. Two units located on the 8th floor of Children's Hospital include the 27 bed Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and the 9 bed Special Care Nursery. The 29 bed Level 2 Nursery is adjacent to Labor and Delivery on the 5th floor of MUSC's Main Hospital. The NICU also supports an infant home monitoring program for infants requiring monitoring upon discharge. The staffing mix includes Registered Nurses, Equipment Technicians, Patient Care Technicians, and Unit Secretaries with ancillary supportive services such as Respiratory Therapy, Pediatric Dietitians, and

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<b>Women Services</b>	
Antepartum/Mother Baby	The Mother Baby Unit/ Antepartum unit is a 29 bed unit providing antepartum, postpartum and newborn care through the Couplet Care model. We also care for moms in 7 couplet care rooms in the NICU. This unit is located in SJCHWP and has a total average daily census of 36. Maternal care is provided for all stable postpartum patients, whether vaginal or cesarean. Neonatal care is provided to all low-risk infants, stable based on perinatal regionalization criteria, including therapies such as phototherapy, IV antibiotics, and low risk NAS support. Primary diagnoses for our antepartum population include preterm labor, premature rupture of membranes, gestational diabetes, and pregnancy-induced hypertension. The staffing mix includes Registered Nurses, Patient Care Technicians and Unit Secretaries.
Labor & Delivery	MOBC is a Level IV perinatal center that delivers approximately 2,700 patients annually. The Labor and Delivery area consists of 9 LDRs, 2 ORs, 2 PACU beds, and 2 Triage rooms. In addition to vaginal and cesarean deliveries, L&D provides operative services such as cerclage and tubal ligation. Maternal support includes management of induction, TOLAC, gestational/chronic diabetes, hypertension, and other high risk intrapartum conditions including acceptance of high risk maternal transfers from the region. All RN's attend AWHONN Fetal Monitoring training. Perinatal palliative care is available as needed. The staffing mix includes Registered Nurses, Certified Surgical Technicians and Unit Secretaries. We will be moving to a newly built, state-of-the-art Children's and Women's Hospital in October of 2019.
<b>Perioperative Services</b>	
Main Operating Room	The Main Operating Room is within a level-one, academic trauma center. There are 21- OR suites which cover all surgical specialties, to include; Trauma, Transplant, Ortho, Neuro, ENT, GU-GYN, Robotics and Pediatric hearts. The nursing teams consists of 75% Registered Nurses and 25% Certified Surgical Technologist. RN's are trained to both scrub and circulate surgical procedures. The Main OR is a busy and dynamic nurse driven, Magnet designated department, that provides cutting-edge technology to the citizens of SC.
<b>Acute, Critical &amp; Trauma</b>	
Transitional Care Unit (TCU)	TCU is a 14 unit which offers restorative and supportive services, while resolving barriers to discharge, within an interdisciplinary model or care for patients who are medically stable.
General Surgery (6W)	6W is a 15 bed surgical/trauma unit providing pre/postoperative acute care to patients undergoing a wide variety of surgical procedures.
Medical Surgical Unit (8W)	8West Medical Acute Care Unit is a 24 bed inpatient Medical-Surgical Unit which provides care to an adult and geriatric patient population. 8West is identified as the designated research floor for the organization with national recognition for the Liberate Pulmonary Study. Other research studies to include Alzheimer's, Renew, Melanoma, Plexifor, IV Carbamazepine, and Yohimbine are performed regularly. 8West provides holistic care for the patient with internal medicine issues of an acute and chronic nature to include but not limited to Sick Cell Anemia, Cystic Fibrosis, Pulmonary Hypertension, Diabetes, COPD, Lupus, Sepsis, and Peritoneal Dialysis.
<b>Heart Center</b>	
CVICU	The CVICU is a 21 bed cardiovascular intensive care unit specializing heart failure, VAD and heart transplant work-ups, LVAD, heartware, heart transplantation, double lung transplantation, cardiac surgeries to include coronary bypass, valve replacements and repairs, aortic dissection repairs, thoracic surgeries to include esophagectomies and pneumonectomies. We also have a lot of devices i.e. balloon pumps, centrimgas/ECMO, as well as all heart ware, HMII and HMIII. Because we are specialized and high paced unit we get surgical and medical patients so orientation is pretty extensive. We also have the capabilities of reopening a chest at the bedside, placing chest tubes, thoracentesis/paracentesis and other procedures that in other places may require going to the OR or procedural suite. There are always opportunities to develop and grow within the unit. There's Shared Governance, RSL/CSL, preceptor, RN III.
<b>Transplant Services</b>	
6E - Renal Transplant/Nephrology	6 East Transplant is a 22 bed intermediate medical-surgical unit. Five of the 22 beds have bedside monitors to accommodate transplant patients who need to be closely monitored. The predominate population cared for are pre- and post-operative transplant (liver, kidney, kidney/pancreas), nephrology and urology patients.

<b>Neurosciences</b>	
Neuro Expansion Unit	This brand new Neuro/General Surgery Unit is a 25 mixed bed neurosurgery and general surgery unit serving any related patient with or without stepdown component.
<b>Surgical Specialty &amp; Spine</b>	
10W Orthopedics/Trauma & Spine	10 West is a 21 bed inpatient medical-surgical unit located in the west wing on the 10th in the main hospital building. All patient rooms are private. The predominate population are patients who are admitted for traumatic and orthopaedic injuries; general surgery, plastic surgery which requires restorative and/or reconstructive procedures, and elective spine surgery patients, all of which are hemodynamically stable. Adult and geriatric patients may be admitted when not filled to capacity.
<b>Musculoskeletal Services</b>	
10E Total Joint Replacement Unit (TJRC)	10 East is a 20-bed orthopaedic unit located on the 10 <sup>th</sup> floor of the main hospital. The patient population cared for on 10 East is hemodynamically stable with adult and geriatric patients having elective or traumatic joint replacement, revisions, and neuro/spine patients. The joint replacement unit also admits adult and geriatric stable Orthopaedic patients, and 23 hour observation patients or stable "off service" patients when necessary to accommodate hospital needs.
<b>Oncology</b>	
ART 7E Hematology Oncology	ART 7 East is a 19 bed unit that specializes in the care and treatment of Adult Malignant and Benign Hematology, and Oncology patients. The unit manages patients receiving inpatient chemotherapy, and complications of cancer treatment. Along with these designated patients, there are also a variety of medical surgical patients that are placed in our care. The patients tend to range from moderate to high acuity. Because of the specialty of populations in our care, nurses are required to obtain chemotherapy/biotherapy certification within the first year of employment and encourages, and offers, opportunities for their nurses to obtain specialty certification in a number of areas to include oncology, med/surg, and palliative care.
ART 7W	ART 7 West is known as "The Hope Unit", a 23 bed adult setting, specializing the care and treatment of Adult Bone Marrow Transplant and Malignant Hematology patients. The unit manages patients receiving inpatient chemotherapy, transplantation, and those currently enrolled in clinical trials. The patients tend to range from high to extreme acuity and require constant and consistent observation and assessment. Because of the specialty of populations in our care, The Hope Unit requires chemotherapy/biotherapy certification within the first year of employment and encourages, and offers, opportunities for their nurses to obtain specialty certification in a number of areas to include oncology, bone marrow transplant, med/surg, and palliative care.
<b>Mental Health</b>	
Psych D Pod / ER	Our Adult ER D Psychiatric Pod is a psychiatric acute care emergency service. These pods serve a psychiatric patient population 5 years of age and over, who require rapid stabilization of high acuity presentations and are unable to care for themselves in less restrictive environments. Primary diagnoses of the patient population span the continuum of child, adolescent and adult psychiatric and substance abuse illnesses, including psychotic disorders, depression, other mood disorders, panic disorders, as well as brain, personality and substance use disorders.

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
